Change in Pennsylvania Law Expands

Car Accident Victims' Rights The Pennsylvania Supreme Court recently upheld a ruling invalidating the "regular use exception" to uninsured/underinsured motorist (UM/UIM) liability coverage. The Supreme Court's decision is a monumental win for car accident victims who sustain injuries when they are driving their work vehicles. In light of the Court's decision, insurance companies can no longer unjustly deny victims benefits that they are entitled to through their personal policies simply because their motor vehicle accident takes place in a work vehicle. If you are seriously injured in a car accident that is not your fault, you have the right to seek


